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1 MS. BETSCH: Good morning. This is a  
2 formal meeting of the Healthcare Administration  
3 Board. Adequate notice of this meeting has been  
4 published in accordance with the provisions of the  
5 New Jersey Open Public Meetings Act including, but  
6 not limited to, N.J.S.A. 10:4-9.1, 10:4-9.3 and  
7 10:4-10.

8 Notice was sent to the Secretary of  
9 State who posted the notice in a public place.  
10 Notice was also provided electronically on the  
11 department's website and forwarded to two New Jersey  
12 newspapers.

13 I will now call the role.

14 Ms. Jenkins.

15 MS. JENKINS: Here.

16 MS. BETSCH: Mr. Paulino.

17 MR. PAULINO: Here.

18 MS. BETSCH: Mr. Havens.

19 MR. HAVENS: Here.

20 MS. JENKINS: Ms. Roberts.

21 MS. ROBERTS: Here.

22 MS. BETSCH: Mr. Baker.

23 MR. BAKER: Here.

24 MS. BETSCH: We have five members of  
25 the board present which does constitute a quorum.

1 MR. BAKER: Thank you. And I said  
2 Donna but it was Lissette.

3 MS. BETSCH: No, we're having  
4 technical issues with the computer so I'm logged in  
5 to Lissette's computer.

6 MR. BAKER: All right. First item is  
7 the approval of minutes June 19, 2025. Would anyone  
8 like to move their adoption?

9 MR. HAVENS: So moved, Ellsworth.

10 MS. ROBERTS: Mary Kay, I'll second.

11 MR. BAKER: Thank you.

12 Any comments, questions, corrections?

13 Hearing none, please call the role.

14 MS. BETSCH: Ms. Jenkins.

15 MS. JENKINS: Yes.

16 MS. BETSCH: Mr. Paulino.

17 MR. PAULINO: Yes.

18 MS. BETSCH: Mr. Havens.

19 MR. HAVENS: Yes.

20 MS. BETSCH: Ms. Roberts.

21 MS. ROBERTS: Yes.

22 MS. BETSCH: Mr. Baker.

23 MR. BAKER: Yes.

24 MS. BETSCH: We have five yeses.

25 Motion carries.

1                   MR. BAKER: Ms. Jenkins,  
2 commissioner's report.

3                   MS. JENKINS: Many of you know  
4 Stefanie Mozgai. She was our deputy commissioner  
5 over health systems. She recently left her position  
6 for a role outside of the department.

7                   We do not have a successor yet for her  
8 but we do with Stefanie all the best in her new  
9 role.

10                  Everyone knows that now we're getting  
11 into respiratory virus season and the department is  
12 encouraging everyone six months and older to get  
13 vaccinated for the new COVID-19 vaccine, and we are  
14 aligning with all meeting medical and public health  
15 associations, including the American Academy of  
16 Family Physicians and the American Academy of  
17 Pediatrics in recommending a yearly flu vaccine for  
18 individuals six months and older, and RSV  
19 vaccination for high risk infants and children,  
20 pregnant individuals and older adults.

21                  And the department -- there's been a  
22 lot of concern about the COVID-19 vaccines this  
23 year. The department has taken steps to remove  
24 barriers to anyone who wishes to get the vaccine.

25                  We issued an executive directive last

1 month that is encouraging everyone six months and  
2 older to get the new COVID-19 vaccine for this  
3 season, and Dr. Sahu, our deputy commissioner over  
4 public health services issued a standing order that  
5 allows authorized pharmacists in New Jersey to  
6 administer the COVID-19 vaccine without a  
7 prescription to individuals three years of age and  
8 older. So that if you would like the vaccine,  
9 please go get it.

10 That's all I have.

11 MR. BAKER: Thanks, Ms. Jenkins.

12 Yeah, there did seem to be confusion.

13 I was getting a lot of questions from people. I  
14 think it's cleared up. When my wife, daughter and I  
15 made our appointments, it was easy just like before.

16 MS. JENKINS: Good. That's good to  
17 hear.

18 MR. BAKER: Ellsworth.

19 MR. HAVENS: Yes. Given the most  
20 recent dues on federal cuts, CDC, etc., do we know  
21 what the impact is on New Jersey?

22 MS. JENKINS: I mean, we're still  
23 assessing everything. I mean, it's all -- every day  
24 it changes. I mean every day.

25 MR. HAVENS: I know.

1 MS. JENKINS: Right now we are in the  
2 shutdown, so the federal shutdown, so some of our  
3 contacts aren't available right now.

4 We are in a lot of litigation  
5 regarding funding and things like that so -- cuts in  
6 funding, so we're kind of in a weird spot right now  
7 figuring out really how this is all going to impact  
8 us.

9 MR. HAVENS: Okay. Thank you.

10 MS. JENKINS: Sorry, that wasn't a  
11 great answer, but it's really -- it changes daily.

12 MR. HAVENS: It is what it is.

13 MR. BAKER: Okay. Mr. Owens, you're  
14 up. We're on number 5 now.

15 MR. OWENS: All right. Good morning,  
16 everybody. How's everybody?

17 My name is Scott Owens. I'm the  
18 health system specialist in the certificate of need  
19 and licensing division.

20 This morning I am requesting your  
21 approval for the notice of adoption -- excuse me --  
22 readoption of New Jersey Administrative Code 8:43,  
23 the standards of licensing of residential health  
24 care facilities located with and operated by  
25 licensed health care facilities without amendments.

1                   The rules were adopted on February 26,  
2     2019, and are scheduled to expire February 26, 2026,  
3     if the department does not readopt them.

4                   The department must file the notice of  
5     readoption with the Office of Administrative Law no  
6     later than 30 days prior to the chapter expiration.

7                   New Jersey administrative Code 8:43,  
8     the standards of residential care, residential  
9     health care facilities located with and operated by  
10    licensed health care facilities contain the rules  
11    for all facilities located and operated by licensed  
12    health care facilities that provide residential  
13    health care services.

14                  These rules constitute the basis for  
15    the license of such residential health care  
16    facilities by the department.

17                  And I'm available to answer any  
18    questions if you have any. Thank you.

19                  MR. BAKER: Thank you, Mr. Owens.

20                  Are there any questions from board  
21    members?

22                  Hearing none, is there anyone in the  
23    public who would like to be heard? This is the  
24    public portion. Is there anyone in the public who  
25    would like to be heard?



1 Donna, anybody raising their hand?

2 MS. BETSCH: No.

20 Ellsworth, take a breath and --

21 MS. ROBERTS: I was going to say, I  
22 can move it.

23 MR. BAKER: -- let Mary Kay.  
24 Ellsworth, you can second.

25 MS. ROBERTS: I will take it and

1        hopefully I have the right one. who knows.

2                        I move the approval of the notice of  
3        readoption standards for licensure of residential  
4        health care facilities located with and operated by  
5        licensed health care facilities codified at N.J.A.C.  
6        8:43.

7                        MR. BAKER: Is there a second,  
8        Ellsworth?

9                        MR. HAVENS: Second.

10                      MR. BAKER: Thank you.

11                      MR. HAVENS: I got that right.
